come join me for tea!”*





“You want me as bacon!” the wary pig cried.




“Now brother,” said Pig One in tears of dismay.

This time I'm prepared. It's the wolf's turn to fear!"




Meanwhile the wolves and the three little pigs


Why was this whole situation the wolf's fault?

You can recover. You are strong enough.


Forgiving doesn't mean you agree with what they did.


COPING WITH CHANGE

ASKING FOR HELP


The Little Red Hen believes she must do everything all by herself ... but can she?



BEING CONSIDERATE


One theft leads to another ... can greedy Jack see sense before his luck runs out?


LISTENING TO OTHERS

GROWING GRATITUDE


The Billy Goats Gruff set out in search of the greenest grass ... but what about the troll?

- ✓ And I'll trust slowly if the trust is new.




**INSPIRING
